

## Uniforms

Drivers and conductors of public passenger vehicles must be in uniform when operating such vehicles.

Drivers and conductors found in breach of this regulation will be prosecuted and may be fined up to \$75,000.00.

**For Owners and Operators of Public Passenger Vehicles (PPVs)**

## *Your Responsibility*

The Transport Authority strives to maintain order and discipline in the public transportation sector. The safety of passengers is of special concern and that of school children in particular.

This publication aims to provide you with the information you need to ensure that your vehicle as well as the operator (s) function within the confines of the law.

As responsible citizens of Jamaica, we implore you to join us in making the safety of commuters and children in particular a priority.

## *Dark Tint*

Operators/Owners who install or allow the installation of curtains, screens or other similar items that prevent an inward view of the interior of the vehicle is guilty of an offence.

Such persons will be prosecuted and may be fined up to \$25, 000.00.

Section 15B - Transport Authority Regulations 2005



## *Markings*

An owner/operator who allows graphics, wordings or markings to be made on the vehicle, before receiving approval to do so commits an offence.

Such persons will be prosecuted and may be fined up to \$25, 000.00.

Section 16 (2) - Transport Authority Regulations 2005

Operators/owners who wish to put markings on their vehicles must write a letter to the Transport Authority requesting permission to do so. A sample of the design must also be submitted with the request.
